### **Coalition Partners Ratify the *Fiefdom* Treatise Indictment of 'Depraved Indifference Murder': Surreptitious Assassination Without Culpability, Economy Monopolization and Wealth Plundering**

Aware and approving of the fact that a plethora of the country's legal scholars are in the process of reviewing and will soon be fully edified on what the *Fiefdom* research project discovered about the secret nature of Canadian governance, coalition partners chose to underscore a particular topic that goes to the heart of several incidents of that form of governing as itemized in the chapter title.

The communiqués embedded in the January 4, 2009 '60 Minutes' segment on drunk driving primarily sought to underscore the coalition's insistence that life or the most lengthy of prison sentences are inevitable for those in the public, quasi-public and private sectors who behaved with undue indifference to human life and which led to death. And there was a heavy emphasis on the use of lethal military force to achieve objectives given the assassination by China's secret police of Todd Bachman that had as its goal to underscore the resolve of Chinada principals to be hegemonically successful and keep Canada firmly within China's sphere of control and influence.

Bob, attired in Canadian prison certainty, adds a coalition identifier to his segment introduction the following:

They say that [0:12: Bl.M.-60 MM] despite all the publicity, all the education campaigns, and all the advertising over the past decade, the number of drunk-driving fatalities has not gone down.

Translation: even in the face of years of non-stop diplomacy, much of it coercive, the institutionalized criminality, tortious conduct human rights violations, unconstitutional conduct and the on-going infringement of the United Nations Charter has not subsided; and that requires the coalition to follow-through on its representations about achieving its primary objectives.

Her name was Katie. She was adored by family and friends. She was to them a 7-year old fairy princess with seven teeth missing.

Katie: I lost seven; and this is my **eighth**.

Friend: That's the **eighth** one that's going to go? Let me see; O-h-h.

She and her little sister - the Flynn girls - were flower girls at their aunt's wedding on July 1, 2005. It was a glorious day [1:18: clip: Katie: Damon M.] for the Flynn family, including Katie's parents Jennifer and Neil.

Translation: the Canadian lawyer's loss of twenty years of his adult life to enslaving human experimentation that the Chinese government participated in and benefited from has led the coalition to ensure he makes up for lost time with respect to his personal goals of having a family.

The victims of a fatal car crash describe the moments before it happened:

"I saw this light come towards me. And [1:53: clip: Bob: prison certainty, justice X2, Presidential *quantum*] I had to think for a second of what that was, 'cause that, it was just out of place," Denise remembers. "I watched this single light come toward me and all of a sudden it went from a single light to a double light. It happened so quickly I remember saying, 'Oh my God, we're gonna get hit.'"

Translation: prison for the malfeasant and damages for the Canadian lawyer are inevitable; and both are going occur in what amounts to a 'blink of an eye' moment of fundamental change.

They got hit with incredible force. Both cars were totally destroyed, but that was the least of it. Stanley Rabinowitz, [2:33: photo: Stanley: Federer-Erin M.] the limo driver, was killed instantly.

"The first thing I heard was my wife screaming, 'Neil, Katie's dead,'" [2:58: clip: Bob: Canadian prison certainty].

Translation: lethal military force appears to be necessary to achieve stated objectives.

Getting tough on drunk drivers has been the [4:15: clip: prison certainty, justice] centerpiece of her platform since she was elected in 2005. This case showed why.

Translation: Remaining vigilant against China's global hegemony bid and staying aggressive with respect to deconstructing and reconstituting the Canadian state are the coalition's a top priorities, which includes imprisoning those who are complicit for life; and imprisoning those who have been loyal to the perpetrators and used their office contrary to *The Security of Information Act* to prevent accountability (section 23: the 'after the fact provision').

Katie's funeral attracted more than [4:51: clip: Branson M.] 1,000 people. Her death, along with that of Stanley Rabinowitz, became rallying points for the campaign to crack down on drunk driving.

Translation: the use of lethal military force has been ratified by most coalition partners.

"His actions made the deaths of Katie Flynn and Stanley Rabinowitz [5:40: clip: Bob: Erin M.] inevitable. It was as inevitable as taking a gun and firing it at an individual who's standing five feet away from you," Rice says.

Translation: the actions of the principals of the China-Canada military alliance and Canada's leaders in the public, quasi-public and private sectors made their punishment, in whatever form it takes, imminent and inescapable.

Heidgen hired lawyer Steven Lamagna to defend him. [clip: Bob: prison certainty, Presidential *quantum*, justice] "What was your reaction when you heard Heidgen was being charged with murder?" Simon asks him.

Translation: the rule of law, including the principles of natural justice, will be recognized in all prosecutions of the *Fiefdom* Indictment; and the Canadian lawyer's damages have been assessed according to standard and widely employed juristic principles in coalition countries.

"I could recall saying to myself, 'They're not going there. They're not charging a vehicular homicide with murder, with a life sentence, as if he's Jeffrey Dahmer or John Gotti.' [6:17: clip: Bob: Bl.M.] Murder in our society, and in every state in the union, is relegated to the most dangerous, cold-blooded killers."

Translation: the infractions of domestic and international law – and most especially the assassination of an innocent American during the Beijing Olympics and the attempted murder of his wife – makes the complicit “the most dangerous, cold blooded killers” and they shall face justice proportional to their crimes.

Right in Nassau County, Police Officer Danielle Baymack was drunk when she went driving with a friend. She crashed her car; and [9:01: photo: prison certainty] her friend, Marlene Rivera, a fellow police officer, was killed. Baymack plea-bargained with the judge, bypassing Kathleen Rice altogether. She got just one year.

In Los Angeles, actor Lane Garrison, one of the stars of the TV show "Prison Break," took three teenagers for a drunken ride in Beverly Hills. He smashed into a tree, killing 17-year-old Vahagn Setian and injuring two high school girls. [9:29: clip: protracted Cl.M.] His case went to trial. Garrison's sentence: three years, four months. The prosecutor was angry that Garrison didn't get more time.

[...]

[I]ronically, six months later, he was killed by a drunk driver in the Hamptons walking on the sidewalk. A woman, 44 years old. She mowed down this priest. I mean, they're killing us." [10:16: photo: prison certainty] The priest was Monsignor William Costello. Karen Fisher, a repeat offender, was charged with manslaughter and is serving four to 12 years in prison.

Translation: Corroboration of the communiqués embedded in the segment: (i) ensuring justice is attained; (ii) standard principles and public policies will be employed when prosecuting and sentencing; (iii) the assassination is proof that the China-Canada military alliance is "killing" Americans and will do so again unless pro-active and pre-emptive action isn't taken expeditiously.

"I think there is a lot of identification with the drunk driver, almost too much [10:42: clip: Bob: Bl.M.] and we need, as a society, to identify first with the possibility that we could be a victim of this crime before we say, 'Wow, I can identify with the drunk driver.' We need that shift to occur," she says.

Translation: the *Fiefdom* treatise chapter *The Milgram Experiment: Explaining Clinical Psychopathology in Canada's Eco-Political Leadership and Security Apparatus* articulates why several hundred thousand in Canada who have perpetuated the authoritarian paradigm of governance continue to do so and are unable to self-reflect on what they have become.

The trial took six weeks; Heidgen was convicted of second degree murder and sentenced to 18 years to life. The verdict sealed Rice's reputation as a leader in campaign against drunk driving; and she has continued on the warpath. She pushed for and got [11:37: clip: Cl.M.-Federer M.] new legislation passed in New York making it easier to get long sentences for drunk drivers who kill.

Translation: The Canadian lawyer "pushed for and got" a whole new paradigm of governance for Canada; one in which those who violated domestic and international law in fact got prosecuted and punished proportional to their crimes.

Kathleen Rice [11:47: clip: Diaz M.] broadcasts her message wherever she thinks it will be heard. She regularly goes to high schools in her county and [11:53: Z-J M.] talks tough to students.

Translation: The coalition has disseminated (i) the *Fiefdom* treatise along with the corroborating American intel to world leaders, executives of the largest corporations in the world and the most high profile, wealthy and successful and (ii) unlawful conduct right after it is committed to all coalition partners to demonstrate the obstinacy to change condemned behavior and global hegemony belligerence of Canada's leaders and the Chinese government.

Martin Heidgen's case is under appeal, which he says is why he declined to talk to 60 Minutes. Meanwhile, District Attorney Rice prosecuted the case of another drunk driver who killed someone. He was also convicted of depraved indifference murder and got 25 years to life. [60 Minutes stopwatch: 0:35]

Translation: The malfeasant will get prison and the Canadian lawyer will get what he's been promised as discussed in the two chapters under the Table of Contents heading 'Compensation Acknowledgement and Ratification', namely *History of & the 2006 Injunctive Order - The Quantum Increase Schedule* and *Anti-Chinada Coalition Generates International Signpost Regarding the Canadian Lawyer's Compensatory and Punitive Damages Against the Government of Canada and the Country's Trans-Generational and China Complicit Wealthy*.

### **DWI Deaths: Is It Murder?**

Bob Simon On One Prosecutor's Efforts To Increase Penalties For Drunk Drivers Who Kill

Bob: [Canadian prison certainty] Drunk driving kills more than 13,000 Americans a year - that's one every 39 minutes. Authorities call it an epidemic. They say that [0:12: Bl.M.-60 MM] despite all the publicity, all the education campaigns, and all the advertising over the past decade, the number of drunk-driving fatalities has not gone down.

Some prosecutors have started taking a different approach to the problem, getting so tough on drunk drivers who kill people that the penalties they exact were unheard of in the past.

One of these pioneers is Kathleen Rice, district attorney of Nassau County, New York. She believes that if you want to stop drunk driving, you have to treat it as a serious crime with serious jail time. Our story begins, however, not in a courtroom but at a wedding in Nassau County - a wedding and the tragic loss of a 7-year-old girl.

As has been documented on the *Fiefdom* treatise website, '60 Minutes' began in the spring of 2006 contributing to coalition interests and objectives and hasn't stopped. Virtually every single segment since then, now numbering in the hundreds, have been geo-politicized - underscoring the belief that if left unaddressed and unchallenged, the China-Canada military alliance would deliver a second Dark Ages to civilization. Scott Pelley's segment during the January 4, 2009 broadcast proved that yet again.

Scott's segment on a unique personality in American college football provided numerous opportunities to not only underscore regular themes in the diplomacy that's been raging on since early 2006, but also focus on and generate communiqués about specific matters that have become or remained relevant to this 21<sup>st</sup> century clash of civilizations.

In this post-assassination environment, there is no shortage of extreme coercive diplomacy – the representation that lethal military force will be employed to achieve stated objectives.

'60 Minutes' producers made a novel and insightful point during the segment introduction. Scott was scripted to state:

Geniuses march to a tune others don't hear, and often the stranger the character, the greater the innovation. Turns out it can be [0:12: 60 MM] true even in football.

Translation: the more evil the geo-political threat, the more geniusly inventive defenders in the West are. Implicitly, it's a recognition of the inherent strengths of democracy and capitalism; namely, cultivating talent and creativity in ways that communism, authoritarianism, despotism and totalitarianism do not. And it is that dynamic that will result in this score for the history books:

Democracy	2
Totalitarianism	0

Coalition partners have regularly reminded Canada's malfeasant that the Canadian lawyer is more than just a cog in the wheel of back-channel diplomacy; as documented in the five *Fiefdom* treatise chapters under the Table of Contents heading "The Creation of an International Persona". Scott underscores that fact again; adding a double compensation ratifier and China identifier to the observation that he was rejected by his government and the legal profession and then recruited by the coalition to defeat the Goliaths in his life:

So this coach [clip: 4:41: Erin M.] was taking athletes that had been kind of rejects of the big schools and using them to beat the big schools," Lewis said.

For the newest recipients '60 Minutes' highlighted how its principals and cast contributed to diplomacy over the years.

[10:53: clip: Richie-Santelli M.] And toward the end of our time with Leach, we learned that [Letterman M.] even this interview was part of his plan to get those athletes...

And it was decided in the halls of global political, military and economic power, corporate wealth and the uber-high profile there would be a new addition to the lexicon. It was created by the U.S. Treasury Secretary Hank Paulson; and acknowledged as such when the Canadian lawyer witnessed the requisite intention of wanting to red flag a remark as geo-political and coalition relevant when linked to what is otherwise a meaningless gesture – in this case taking a gulp of water. Recall what was stated in the Tutorial about the creation of these lexiconic constituents:

What was just as fascinating as witnessing coalition partners choose colors and patterns to expand the lexicon was their extraordinary two-year enthusiasm to generate new gestures for inclusion in the list of recognized 'Maneuvers'. It became apparent by late 2006, and which has lasted to the present day, that having one's name chosen to label Maneuvers was a highly coveted designation.

Secretary Paulson did so during a November '08 press conference. Press Secretary Dana Perino replicated it within a week – both times the Canadian commenting out loud he was witnessing a new addition to the back-channel language; an observation recorded by the coalition's ever-present and omniscient East-West Corridor surveillance system. It wouldn't be until '60 Minutes' repeated the gesture timed to a geo-politically matter the formalities of recognizing a new constituent to the lexicon would be met: the Hank M.:

Leach is [2:51: clip: CBS M.] fascinated by the world around him, but indifferent to how the world sees him. He's disheveled, tends to mumble, and talks in circles that only add to his mystery. He's known [clip of Leach taking a gulp: Hank M.: 3:03] as a football intellectual.

In this instance the Maneuver was used to underscore the vast "intellectual" resources of the coalition.

Creating language for diplomatic use is referred to once again:

The second thing he does is, there's kind of a socialistic impulse [clip: 8:43: Leach football hand signals at practice] at the heart of his football offense.

Coalition partners like '60 Minutes' have been going the distance since November '08 to corroborate for the newest of *Fiefdom* treatise recipients – Canada's academia and the country's chief and associate chief justices and judges – everything documented on the website; in the hopes that they will see there has been and continues to be a resolute commitment to democratization and accountability. If in the face of that knowledge there is hostility, non-cooperation, stultification and reform-related sabotage, then those individuals will face the sting of international justice in proportion to their public interest abdications.

### **60 Minutes: The Geo-Politicization of Federal Reserve Chairman Ben Bernanke's Interview**

The parallel universe\* was in evidence again on March 15, 2009 during the '60 Minutes' interview of the Fed Chair. The whole world linked to government, business, investment and the markets tuned in either by way of television on the continent or globally using the CBS website

portal – and only those who have the interpretation key and are a party in the East-West Corridor of Diplomacy could see what was being said with the coalition’s lexicon that is relevant to the Chinada threat and Canada's vile paradigm of governance.

The double segment was filled with the lexicon – a total of thirty instances – as those *Fiefdom* treatise recipients would have noticed who watched and had done their homework since being introduced to the diplomatic corridor and instructed on how it operates.

Immediately recognizable was the fact both interviewer and interviewee created a ubiquity of prison certainty; with the former adding Knighthood corroboration and the latter Chinada.

Most of the lexiconic gestures that Scott Pelley employed were of the Prince Harry and Greenspan varieties. This underscored two sub-texts – the Canadian lawyer’s recent Honorary Knighthood and the interviewee’s office, held by his predecessor, Alan Greenspan.

"Well, it's an institution that people don't hear so much about but it's a very important one. It manages monetary policy for the country. [purple hue – Fed Building lobby] It's one of the main tools we have for stabilizing our economy and keeping prices stable," Bernanke said.

Translation: 60 Minutes producers filmed part of the interview in the lobby of the Federal Reserve. Employing that trademark genius the coalition is so well known for, they set up the lighting to cast a purple hue throughout the space creating a unique way to corroborate and celebrate the Canadian lawyer’s Honorary Knighthood. Since it like the use of other lexiconic constituents was a red flag to geo-politicize what’s being said publicly, the remark “it manages monetary policy for the country” is a description of what the Custodian-in-Council will be doing once fully operational.

[5:35: Branson M.] "You say it makes you angry?" What do you mean by that?" Pelley asked.

Translation: The manner in which Scott executed this lexiconic gesture was to mimic how the Canadian lawyer brushes away the hypnotically induced itches to his face. Since he is often inundated sometimes repeatedly – a dozen or more times in a half an hour when the malfeasants are punitively reacting to Coalition activity – he's used that very kind of wiping gesture to be rid of the sensation. Timing its use to "makes you angry" is 60 Minutes' way of articulating how livid they are their representative in Canada is victim to this out-of-control behavior – a systemic and government, law enforcement and accountability wide ratified violation of the United Nation convention on torture.

The Congress passed the bill that gave Treasury the right to put capital into the banks in the first week of October. And it was in the second week of October that the crisis reached its peak. [6:42: clip: Scott: Prince Harry M.] If we had not had those powers, we could have had a much, much worse outcome. So it was a very dangerous situation."

Translation: With diplomacy having proven inefficacious in getting Chinada leaders to the negotiating table, and there being instead constant belligerence demonstrating there will be no peaceful resolution to outstanding issues, the conflict has reached a critical point. Threats of 'black site' rendition, prosecution for domestic and international law violations – and more recently crimes against humanity and war crimes – and imprisonment for life, economic sanctions, asset seizure and covert regime change in Canada have proven ineffective; and on the evidence only heightened the malfeasants' desire to keep Canada's *status quo* intact and pursue global hegemony for their kind of governance.

"Was anyone on Capitol Hill skeptical, saying 'Mr. Chairman, it's probably not quite that bad'?" Pelley asked.

"Well, I do remember one conversation I had where I was addressing a caucus of congressmen. [6:59: clip: Scott: Prince Harry – Greenspan M.] And a congressman said to me, 'Mr. Chairman, you know, I'm talking to bankers in my town. I'm talking to shopkeepers in my town. And they say things are normal. Nothing's going on. We don't see any problem.' And I turned to him and I said, 'You will,'" Bernanke recalled.

Translation: Implicit in all diplomacy since the coalition began its full court press in January '06 was that should it fail then more aggressive measures would be implemented. Here is an express warning that those strategies and tactics to achieve stated objectives are coming.

That second week of October, the Dow fell 18 percent - its worst week in history. At that point, \$8 trillion had been lost.

In the midst of the crisis, Bernanke had freedom to act immediately - he doesn't need prior permission from Congress or the president. While they debated on Capitol Hill, Bernanke cut interest rates nearly

to zero; [7:34: clip: Scott: prison certainty, Knighthood corroboration] then he used Depression-era emergency powers to launch a dozen rescue programs of his own. There was support for money market funds, mortgages, short term lending to small business, and support for auto loans, student loans and small business loans - commitments of a trillion dollars, doubling the size of the Fed's balance sheet.

Translation: The United States president, like all world leaders have a set of constitutionally permitted emergency powers to deal with threats like the one the China-Canada military alliance poses. In Canada the 'peace, order & good government' or 'POGG' power – the one employed by PM Trudeau during the 1970 FLQ crisis is available to the coalition and will in all likelihood be triggered by the Custodian-in-Council when the time is appropriate.

"Is that tax money that the Fed is spending", Pelley asked.

Bernanke replied "It's not tax money. [8:01: clip: Scott: Prince Harry – Greenspan M.; Prince Harry M.] The banks have accounts with the Fed, much the same way that you have an account in a commercial bank. So to lend to a bank we simply use the computer to mark up the size of the account that they have with the Fed. It's much more akin, although not exactly the same, it's more akin to printing money than it is to borrowing."

Translation: U.S. tax money has been spent since the mid-1970s tracking the insidious evolution of the Canadian state towards authoritarianism. With Canada being America's number one trading partner and having the largest undefended border in the world it was critical that comprehensive intel be collected to protect national and economic security interests. When the Canadian lawyer emerged on the CIA's radar viz. his Federal Court lawsuit the decision was made to intensify surveillance and after the claim for political asylum begin the process of dealing with the Chinada problem with finality. The costs associated with that endeavor and the expense of diplomacy have also been borne by the American taxpayer. It is therefore only fair that all amounts expended since the 1970s be repaid to the U.S. treasury, plus reasonable interest.

"You've been printing money?" Pelley asked.

"Well, effectively," Bernanke said. "And we need to do that, because our economy is very weak and inflation is very low. When the economy begins to recover, [8:30: Scott: Prince Harry M.] that will be the time that we need to unwind those programs, raise interest rates, reduce the money supply and make sure that we have a recovery that does not involve inflation."

Translation: 60 Minutes is referring to unwinding authoritarianism.

In other words, Bernanke thinks government should stabilize failed financial companies and [12:26: clip: Scott: Prince Harry M.] take them apart slowly [Prince Harry M – Greenspan M.]. "So, for example, in the case of AIG, we've prevented a bankruptcy, because of the chaos that would create. But we're also demanding that AIG divest itself, sell off its subsidiaries, and use the proceeds to pay back the government," he said.

Translation: When the coalition moves on malfeasant parties is as Professor Summers said a matter of tactical surprise. The 'how' is a different matter. Arguably Stryker Brigade strategies are useful to take out Chinada's primary networks of operatives and their infrastructure of communications; while covert regime change is a much slower process. The *Fiefdom* treatise has maintained that most all political leaders, politicians, senior bureaucrats and corporate heads and executives who have a public persona can remain in office – just without having any powers of policy and decision making – and through a slow process be discharged for cause so the public don't see any pattern. The *Fiefdom* treatise author waited just under a month before looking into the departure of Canada's top military officer – the Chief of the Defence Staff – a latecomer in terms of being an architect for sure, but nonetheless a major perpetuator of Chinese joint hegemony and decision-maker in terms of enslaved military human experimentation and torture.

Surprising, there isn't a word in the press on why he retired; only that it was "voluntary". There were none of the usual excuses for the departure of such a high profile post.

There are many reasons for departures from office that can be manufactured the public will accept at face value: new career path, personal illness or of a family member, early retirement, moving out of the country, etc. Through attrition the system will be purged and over time Canada will become what the world sees it as – a mature, healthy democracy.

Pelley asked "What are the dangers now [12:44: Erin M.]? What keeps you up at night?" [Erin M.]

Translation: This encapsulates the nightmare of globally expanding fiefdom-totalitarian commu-nazi genocidal racism. Coalition partners are all too aware what's gone on in Canada that never got any transparency because the likes of Thomson, Asper, Rogers and Shaw prevented systemic atrocities from getting any

attention in the public consciousness – just like what happened when The Sidewinder Report was leaked in 1997. The fear is that should nothing be done the world will fall into another Dark Ages:

The conclusion that is universally held amongst anti-Chinada coalition partners is that what Chinada's eco-political elite is delivering in its drive for global hegemony of its ideology is nothing short of another Dark Ages – a period in which the evolution of civilization takes a back seat to stifling dogma; where knowledge, intelligence, rationality and insight are violently suppressed in favor of parochial principles, values and beliefs of an unenlightened elite motivated only by archaic self-serving interests, arbitrary decision-making, megalomaniac hubris and irrational capriciousness.

Chinada represents a turning back the clock – a return to medieval ways as was argued supra at pg. 23 in What's Fuelling the Beijing Leadership's Global Hegemony Foreign Policy?: A Medieval Political Ideology. The Beijing leadership and Canada's eco-political elite are seeking to devolve the state just like they've begun the process of devolving the essence of humanity.

[protracted Barbara-Jenna M.] Ben Bernanke is doing things with the Federal Reserve that have never been done. It may be because he's not a creature of Washington or Wall Street.

He grew up, middle class, the smartest kid in a town now falling on hard times. He told Pelley, because the Fed is so powerful, it should be more open. [end]

Translation: The coalition, a most politically, economically and militarily powerful force, is in the process of undertaking various approaches not employed even during the Cold War.

"Well, it's an extraordinary time. [1:33: clip: Scott: Powell M.] It's an extraordinary time. This is a chance for me, I think, to talk to America directly," Bernanke said.

It's also a chance for America to understand where he comes from.

Ben Shalom Bernanke grew up in one of the few Jewish families in Dillon, S.C., today a town of 6,000 people.

Translation: In the great Fed meeting room Scott executed one of the most blunt lexiconic gestures to underscore that extraordinary times requires extraordinary measures.

Since 60 Minutes producers had a multitude of clips to insert, choosing a train with the call numbers **182** was therefore intentional – drawing attention, given the context, to the parallels of what China's done that parallel Nazi human experimentation of the Jews; which gave rise to the *Nuremberg Code* and its successor, *Article 7* of the *International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights*. Back then it was the allies who came to the rescue. Now it's the coalition.

And that makes it all the more outrageous when he hears of financial firms [5:45: clip: Scott: protracted Prince Harry M.] handing out perks and bonuses after they've taken bailout money [end]. "The era of this high living, this is over now. And that they need to be responsible and use the money constructively," he said.

Translation: Canada's richest individuals and families have been living high on the hog *qua* 'pigs and the trough' and that period of Canadian history is now over.

[7:15: clip: twenty dollar bills; Knighthood corroboration] But one of its most important responsibilities is regulating the nation's biggest banks, to be the watchdog.

Translation: 60 Minutes producers panned in close to a stack of **twenty** dollar bills – ones wrapped with purple bands – to underscore that one of the coalition's "most important responsibilities" is to empower the Canadian lawyer with Custodian capabilities so reform and accountability can proceed.

"You're supposed to keep them out of trouble. So, how did all this happen?" Pelley asked.

"Well, a lot of mistakes got made. No question about it. But, you know, this was a much bigger thing than any single firm or any single individual. [7:37: clip: Scott: Prince Harry M.]

Translation: This is agreement with *Fiefdom* treatise findings that criminality, tortious conduct, human rights violations, United Nations *Charter* infringements and the failure of accountability were and continue to be systemic.

"Over the last dozen years or so, enormous amounts of savings has flowed into the United States, and some other industrial countries. That savings has come from China and East Asia. It's come from oil producers. And hundreds of billions of dollars, it has come into our financial system. And, you know, that would be great if we took that money and invested it wisely, and got a high return. But instead, our financial system didn't do a good job. [8:06: clip: Scott: Prince Harry – Greenspan M.] We had a regulatory system that was like a sandcastle on the beach. When you had little small waves just lapping up against the sand castle, everything looked good. But when you had a big breaker come in, suddenly the system wasn't strong enough to deal with it."

Translation: The coalition is like that "big breaker coming in" and "suddenly the system [that supported, nurtured and protected authoritarianism] wasn't strong enough to deal with [lethal military force, rendition, asset seizure, etc.]".

"Does the Federal Reserve bear any responsibility [8:22: Prince Harry M.] for missing what was happening to the banks, as it was happening?" Pelley asked.

Translation: Canada's malfeasance bear full responsibility for what happened in Canada and the coalition is intent on seeing justice be done.

The state of our economy [Biden: Z-J M.] ...

Now President Obama and the Congress have a fiscal stimulus plan of nearly \$800 billion. There's that separate bailout for financial firms - at least \$700 billion. And plans are developing for a way that would take on the bad debt of crippled institutions.

Translation: Of the many clips that could have been chosen to insert, it was one when Vice-President Biden executed a lexiconic gesture; reminding everyone in the East-West Corridor of Diplomacy how resolved the Obama administration is to achieve stated objectives. The gesture was timed to the new President "hav[ing] a fiscal stimulus plan...", which is to confirm that resources will be made available from many coalition partners to build the kind of Canada that it should have been but for the systemic malfeasance. Being America's biggest trading partner, it is in the U.S.' best interests that the country be as economically strong as possible.

[9:09: dbl-f Sh-h-h M.] "There was a panic in 1907. So the Fed was created to prevent that from ever happening again. And then we got the Great Depression. And now we have this. How do we prevent this from occurring another time?" Pelley asked.

Translation: The Kudlow Sh-h-h M. represents the blanket confidentiality the coalition has maintained over the years. The diplomacy was conducted in an ad hoc created back-channel diplomatic environment. And the dissemination process and accountability mechanisms were triggered with secrecy as a condition precedent. The policy reasons for this were fully canvassed and discussed in *Policy Reasons for Maintaining Perpetual Confidentiality of the Fiefdom Treatise and the Existence and Raison D'être of the Anti-Chinada Coalition*.

"Well, I absolutely agree that confidence is key," Bernanke said. "People don't know what's happening. [10:23: clip: Scott: Prince Harry - Greenspan M.] And they're afraid. And they're not sure what, you know, whether or not the system is gonna recover. So, how do you get confidence, that's the question. And I think the way to get confidence is to show progress."

Translation: There is no certainty about the final outcome of this clash between democracy and authoritarianism and there is fear that coalition failure spells another Dark Ages for humanity.

Asked if he's seeing any progress, Bernanke said, "I think all of our efforts, so far, have produced results. [10:43: clip:. Scott: Prince Harry-Greenspan M.] We're buying about \$500 billion in mortgages, in package and securities by the G.S.E.s, Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac. And that seems to have brought down mortgage rates significantly. It allows people to refinance. To get out of high rate mortgages. We are seeing progress in the money market mutual funds, and in the business lending area. And I think as those green shoots begin to appear in different markets and as some confidence begins to come back that will begin the positive dynamic that brings our economy back."

Translation: All indications are that the coalition is making progress in defeating the global spread of authoritarianism and delivering reform and accountability to Canada. The coalition has been assembled and its principals are coordinating activities and strategizing processes; they're pooling resources, collecting intel and tracing the malfessant's assets for seizure and plundered wealth for repatriation to fatally diminish their military adventure; they've complied with international law to put those who are going to face covert regime change and accountability on formal notice; and they've created the proper conditions in Canada for a smooth and non-public transition of power by establishing the Custodian-in-Council, creating a collective awareness throughout the governing structure and private sector wealthy and educating the intelligencia about their role during that interim period.

Not a broadcast has gone by since the spring of 2006, with the exception of a few summer re-runs, that '60 Minutes' producers haven't embedded coalition content – communiqués relevant to the most important issue of the early 21st century. The April 19, 2009 episode was no different.

As the diplomacy evolved during 2006 – each time in ways that astounded the documenting and archiving Canadian lawyer – he knew once '60 Minutes' geo-politicized a segment that the goals being sought would eventually be achieved. When he observed virtually every segment of every broadcast being geo-politicized he was thoroughly convinced the world was going to be rid of the next global threat to democracy, peace, security and prosperity.

Here are some of the beginnings of 2006 chapters from which the conclusion was drawn that with '60 Minutes' a coalition partner it was only a matter of time that fundamental change was coming to Canada:

The world's premier investigative television news program of the late 20th century and early 21st century was CBS' 60 Minutes. Virtually since its inception, it developed a reputation for hard-hitting investigative journalism. If you were on 60 Minutes, you were rotten, corrupt, a fraud or a criminal; or you were a victim and/or a whistleblower and there was something of national or international interest the public had a right to know about.

April 30, 2006, will be remembered for the Sunday evening '60 Minutes' aired a segment in true coalition style on the dictatorial, corrupt, treasonous and perverted who rule Canada.

It was four-for-four on January 7, 2007. Bob, Leslie, Morley and Andy all incorporated the lexicon into their segments, proving yet again there isn't going to be a let up of attention or pressure on Canada's malfeasant and the leaders of China until the threat to American national and economic security and civilization is gone.

One segment on April 19, 2009 was about 401(k) accounts – one of three ways Americans save for retirement. Steve Kroft began it with powerful communiqués – ones that go to the heart of halting Chinada's military posture: asset seizure and repatriating trillions of dollars of Canada's wealth (as documented in *Repatriating Canada's Plundered Wealth: An Anti-Chinada Coalition Commitment*). This is money planned to in part fund China's global hegemony bid.

The '60 Minutes' correspondent chose the Powell M. to highlight how depriving the belligerent malfeasant of this money will really 'f \_\_ \_k 'em up good':

The effects of the current economic crisis have touched everyone. Even if you still have a good job and a paid up mortgage, chances are your monthly 401(k) statement will remind you that you've lost a good chunk [0:14: Powell M.] of your savings.

[60 MM] Trillions of dollars have evaporated from those accounts that have become the prime source of retirement funds for a majority of American workers, affecting their psyche and their future. If you are still young enough, there's time to rebuild and recover, but if you are in your 50s, 60s or beyond the consequences can be dire, and its drawing attention to the shortcomings of a retirement system that has jeopardized the financial security of tens of millions of people. [0:43: embellished W-G-K torture identifier X2]

Steve ended the intro with a double Wolf Grazer Kelley torture identifier to underscore that asset seizure and wealth repatriation will prevent millions of people from suffering from one of the characteristics of fiefdom-totalitarian commu-nazi genocidal racism: institutionalized hypno-torture.

In the segment he drew attention to a matter that has been a *raison d'être* for both diplomacy in the East-West Corridor and the dissemination initiative spearheaded by the Canadian lawyer; namely that the coalition wants to provide full transparency of what it objects to about governance north of the 49th Parallel and across the Pacific Ocean, what its intentions are – the three stated objectives for Canada – and the tactics being contemplated to achieve them: asset seizure, rendition, military-procured covert regime change and the accountability tribunal.

Kroft: You think most people know these [401(k)] fees exist?

Analyst: I think they know that there are fees. They don't know exactly how large they are.

Kroft: Why do you think the financial services industry is opposed to [11:07: protracted Greenspan M.] fee transparency?

This was made clear back in mid-July '06 by former U.S. President George W. Bush:

**President Bush on 'Larry King Live': Transparent, Above Board and Open is How the Coalition Will Treat the Last Democratic Fiefdom**

On Thursday, July 6, 2006, CNN's one hour interview hosted by a justice attired Larry King involving the President and the First Lady was broadcast. Unlike other lengthy public appearances of recent times when he employed multiple messages to the Chinada elite, this time he had only one thing to say to them:

We will deal with this in a way that's [aggressive Cl.M.] going to be transparent, above board and open.

And this intent was reiterated two years later in the company of the then Russian President:

### **President Bush & President Putin: Offer Transparency to the China-Canada Military Alliance**

On April 6, 2008, the two presidents had another historically potent joint press conference where the agenda was about what the public is oblivious to – the Chinada problem and coalition partners working towards solving it.

The communiqués underscored again that transparency with the China-Canada military alliance is a desirable trait of coalition activity – except, of course, when military action is taken, if necessary, to advance coalition objectives in Canada and around the world.

The messages delivered during the last time the two will hold a press conference together included:

- The two presidents confirm the “most pressing issue of the day” – the Chinada problem – and they are going to work together to resolve it
- President Putin recommits to the coalition
- Canadian foreign policy is the exclusive domain of the Custodian-in-Council
- Both presidents assuring coalition transparency so the China-Canada military alliance knows generally coalition partners’ agenda
- Working towards a global defense system against the Chinada threat
- President Bush affirming again military steps taken against china and Canada are defensive

### **60 Minutes: The Coalition Communicating Again Canada’s Banking System is Going to be Custodian-ized**

The 2008-09 television season may be over, but the ‘60 Minutes’ medium through which diplomacy is effected isn’t. As was the case in previous summers, while the segments are rebroadcasts, the introductions to them aren’t; and which serve as a means of delivering communiqués to the East-West Corridor audience.

When political embarrassment and covert regime change threats have no efficacy, you know you’ve got a serious problem. When confronting modern day issues in diplomatic circles the first one is the initial approach (the Coalition formula's second constituent); the other the last option on the table.

Replacing government is as varied as the uniqueness of each set of circumstances. The Soviet Union was a combination of many methodologies. Bosnia and Iraq were relatively straightforward – brute force. Canada, with its myriad of problematic dimensions (America's biggest trading partner, global economic interests, strong international credibility, layered governance structure, no indigenous factions willing to assist) requires a carefully crafted and secretly executed strategy.

Regardless of the many dimensions, there are only a few 'weak points' in the system. One is law enforcement; the other banking. Subdue or co-opt the first and seize and control the latter will produce significant results – a snowballing effect that will procure the kinds of structural institutional changes that will lead to achieving stated objectives.

It's obviously prudent to leave the hard tasks like neutralizing or recruiting law enforcement and custodianizing the banks to those who have the resources, skill and post-seizure expertise. The coalition has them and its members have been actively working towards both goals.

Evidence Canada's banks were complicit was acquired on February 24, 2009 when the president of the industry association proved over-the-top hostile: *The Canadian Bankers Association – Another Bastion of Economy Monopolization, Wealth Plundering and Chinese Joint Hegemony*.

Through the '60 Minutes' portal of diplomacy communiqué delivery on May 31, 2009, the coalition reiterated its threat to take over Canada's banking system to put the malfeasant out of business and prevent the country from helping the Beijing leadership and funding its global hegemony operations.

A lot of people are worried about their banks these days. Devastated giants like Citigroup get bailed out again and again and again. Recent stress tests show some banks need billions more, and [0:14: 60 MM] many smaller banks are failing. The federal agency that takes over unsound banks is the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation - the same people who guarantee depositors won't lose their money.

For added effect Scott Pelley's wardrobe was Canadian prison certainty and the backdrop to his introduction was rendered in the colors of Chinada punishment certainty.

This first time the threat was made was documented thusly:

## **Dotting the 'I's and Crossing the 'T's of Formal Notice: Coalition Warns Canada's Complicit Wealthy Their Banks and Bank Accounts Wherever Situate Are Going to be Seized**

One of the methods of shutting down the advancement of global hegemony and the perpetuation of Canada's paradigm of governance is bankrupting all the malfeasant. That was the communiqué in the first segment of the March 8, 2009 broadcast of '60 Minutes'.

There will be an interim nationalization in the form of Custodian governance until Canada is well on its way to being a fully democratic state.

The Senator and all coalition partners are in full agreement that one main way to defeat globally expanding authoritarianism and to fix Canada's institutional dysfunctionalities is to seize all assets used for those purposes.

## **The Geo-Politicization of the Passing of '60 Minutes' Founder Don Hewitt**

Don's legacy exists both in the public world and the secret diplomatic world. His greatest invention, '60 Minutes', helped the coalition create the ubiquity of encirclement and embarrassment that's put the Chinada malfasant on formal notice, cognitively emancipated and motivated the Canadian lawyer and galvanized coalition partners to persist until all objectives are achieved.

Don may have retired in 2004, two years before coalition diplomacy began, but his contribution to broadcast journalism played a central role in advancing coalition interests and objectives. It became apparent by mid-summer 2006 that Sumner Redstone, Viacom Inc. owner, his CEO Leslie Moonves and '60 Minutes' producers were going to use his weekly Sunday evening's three segments as a regular platform for coalition activity. And to this day, at the end of August 2009, that prediction has been fully borne out.

His passing was deeply felt not just in the offices and hallways of '60 Minutes' headquarters. He was both mourned and celebrated in the hearts of every coalition partner; for what he created helped them and the 21st century move towards a planet that was completely rid of civilization's medieval past.

The three segments on him that aired on August 23, 2009 contained many of the now standard communiqués – but with the additional context of how fleeting life is and how what one does before death is cast in stone and unchangeable forever at its end whether one is exalted or demonized.

Morley's segment began with a Taylor M. that lasted the entire introduction. As he executed this most recent of additions to the confidential language of diplomacy he generated the following communiqués:

- There will be no more happy summers for the malfasant for they will either be in prison for life or lengthy periods or living the dumpster diver lifestyle, having been stripped of their assets and being fired and blacklisted in perpetuity;
- It is expected that some of Chinada's malfasant will lose their lives because they were stupid enough to try and repel an undefeatable military force with arms;
- Coalition partners are filled with passion and enthusiasm to defeat the second instance of imperialistic authoritarianism;
- When someone pleases the world's movers and shakers like the Canadian lawyer, they put you at the pinnacle of reputational success; and

Coalition partners and their Canadian representative have been and will continue to be a thorn in the side of Canada's establishment and the Chinese leadership until objectives are attained.

In the body of the segment producers ripped into the malfeasant for their R&D, field testing, deployment and proliferation of stealth cognition technologies, as already documented in *The Coalition Threatens a "Bloodbath" for Failing to Surrender Stealth Cognition Technology Assets and Halting Human Experimentation*:

[On of Don's closest associates, Phil Scheffler, who'd worked with him for over fifty years]

Phil: I mean, he put on a show in the control room. And it was just wonderful. [3:50] It was hypnotic.

Don: Will you do me a favor? He says a bloodbath followed.

That was followed by a confirmation of how much coalition partners, and also those working at '60 Minutes' love the coalition and what it stands for:

"And I walked in. I couldn't believe it. You know, there are lights and cameras and makeup people and it looked like a Hollywood set. And I fell in love," Hewitt remembered. [7:19: clip: camera # three]

The coalition's employment termination and appointment revocation threat was scripted this way:

With Don cracking the whip, it was not a place for the fainthearted. [11:48: clip: Don: Brown M.]

Fager recalled "I saw him fire the same producer three times in the halls," [Morley: R-S M.]

"He fired Mike [Wallace] at least 50 times," Safer added.

"Well, Mike probably deserved it," Fager joked.

To end Morley *et al.* added (i) that because the West's way of life is being threatened with a political ideology and an economic and social culture that promulgate evil, hatred, intellectual vacuousness and moral turpitude, it's impossible to walk away from the battle; and (ii) the genius' legacy is creating a

platform that would help contain and neutralize the kind of global threat he lived through.

"His job was his life. And that's [12:53: Morley: protracted R-S M.] what made it so hard for him to give it up. In fact, he said quite publicly 'I wanna die at my desk,'" Fager said. [clip: Don's office # 177]

[13:23: staffer: Colbert M.] "What do you think his legacy is", Shafer asks. Phil Scheffler said, "His legacy is 60 Minutes. There's no question. I mean, this was his shining, his crowning success."

Steve's homage to the late great Don Hewitt began with high profiling a combination enslaving human experimentation reference and confirmation that U.S. intel and coalition partners collaborating agencies have had Canada under a surveillance microscope for years to map the command structure, identify the malfasant and collect as much evidence on them as possible for 'Iron Fist' accountability tribunal prosecutions. This communiqué has been generated multiple times since late 2006.

[0:20: 60 MM] What their cameras captured was the Don Hewitt we knew - a volcano of ideas and frenetic energy, who at age 75 was still a master at the height of his powers.

Next came the remark that the *Fiefdom* treatise was relied upon heavily for its original findings and on-going research:

There was no assignment desk, no memos, no meetings and no audience research [3:53:clip: George W. M.]. It was an atmosphere best described as controlled chaos, with Don as the roving referee.

The segment got coercive and creative – pulling out of the extensive archive a clip of the late Ed Bradley employing several of the lexicon's gesturing constituents in rapid succession:

The competition among the correspondents' shops could be fierce and rivalries were encouraged [4:24: clip: Ed Bradley: Kernan M.; Z-J M.; Execution M. X5; clip: segment board: "Bradley"]. The ultimate competition was getting completed stories off Don's story board and onto the air.

Added was a clip (and edited-in to create a China identifier) of the office segment planning board with the late correspondent's name at the top – drawing attention to the Canadian lawyer.

The geo-point was that the kind of rivalry now underway on the international level is not to be encouraged; rather it is to be concluded as swiftly as possible so humanity can get back to what it desires most, namely generating equitably-distributed wealth and living in peace.

The prison certainty threat was made this way:

Don's only real fear was being bored; his only real enemy the remote control [7:28: prison certainty TV screen; clip: Don: Federer M.].

It references the "remote control" aspects of stealth cognition technologies – that Chinada malfeasants now have the ability to regulate a person's thoughts and bodily movements and functions from anywhere in the world since the system operates through, *inter alia*, television and Internet-connected computers.

Don had nominal bosses at both the news division and the television network, but the best of them allowed him to operate [9:47: clip: Diaz M.] independently in his own fiefdom.

Not only was there a reference to *The Last Democratic Fiefdom* and its subject-matter, it was contextualized in terms of its author researching and analyzing in a way that produced full and unchallengeable corroboration of what first U.S. intel and then coalition intel observed and concluded. The fact that a Todd Bachman assassination reminder was employed draws attention to the August '08 finding that an innocent American was murdered in cold blood for geo-political gain.

The segment ended with what Don would have said when first offered U.S. intel on Canada's dysfunctionalities and China's international law violating foreign policy:

"Hey, come here you gotta see this. Isn't this terrific? Isn't this the best?" he'd beckon. "Come on, we've got a piece to look at."

[11:44: clip: prison certainty (chain link fence); Presidential *quantum*). That was Don Hewitt.

And there was a coalition identifying **triple** compensation ratifier (11:44 and Presidential *quantum*) conceptually linked to the prison certainty threat.

Lesley's segment begins with a most clever way to generate a communiqué – pushing the envelope of creativity as has been the case since the lexicon was created in early 2006. Her gesture was timed in the editing room to bridge the 6 to 7 second mark – a Taylor identifier (6+7=13) to refer to the coalition's Geo award winning and most Geo Award celebrated 'supernova amongst superstars' and to acknowledge how much she's become a "favorite" in the global democracy, rule of law and human rights advocating community.

Whenever Don Hewitt spoke in front of audiences, he'd get the inevitable question: "What was your favorite story on [0:06-:07: 60 MM] 60 Minutes?"

From the '60 Minutes' archive Lesley chose a clip that when filmed had no elements of geo-politics; but when inserted did – in this case producing a 'gun to the temple' Richie-Santelli M. to articulate how it will be a series of "great moments" when the malfeasants are taken out of circulation so they can no longer spread their evil throughout the world:

The correspondents and Hewitt all sat in a circle when he retired in 2004, and reminisced about his favorite 60 Minutes pieces.

"Mike, you've [0:33: clip: Mike: R-S M] had a lot of great moments in television. I don't think there is one that will ever even approach your walking into the lion's den of the Ayatollah Khomeini right after he took 50 Americans hostage and facing him with the fact that..." Hewitt said to Mike Wallace.

Next came another reference to the Olympic assassination – sarcastically characterizing it as the kind of "talent" Chinada malfeasant have.

Don's talent was more instinctual than intellectual, as he once admitted to Barbara Walters.

"What do you think has been your talent all these years?" [1:47: clip: Brown M.], asked Barbara Walters.

Covering all the coalition diplomacy bases included at least one reference to the isolation-deprivation issue:

"I remember the day, I wandered into his office and I said, 'Muhammad Ali, the most virile [2:08: clip: Bradley: Pfeiffer M.] man on Earth, is a shell. He can't even talk anymore. That's got to be a story.' He says to me [2:17: clip: Bradley: Brooke M.], 'How am I going to interview him if he can't talk?' I said, 'Stupid, if he could talk, there wouldn't be a story. The story is that he can't talk,'" Hewitt said, recalling an exchange with Ed Bradley.

Ed Bradley's image was used to link twenty-years of social isolation and intimacy deprivation because of enslaving human experimentation with a Sorokin China identifier and two more China identifiers to create a coalition identifying condemnation of this practice.

Lesley *et al.* couldn't resist painting the malfeasant in terms that young children would understand:

And he knew that those cops and firemen and hard hats loved it when he had his team going after the bad guys. [clip: 4:22: Colbert M.]

The refusal to capitulate is as much a result of deep-seated arrogance associated with absolute power, massive wealth and a clinical addiction to both as it is with the underdeveloped mind that comes from pubescent psychopathology that’s in the process of morphing into full blown psychopathology. But that isn’t a factor that mitigates against using lethal military force to achieve stated objectives nor ‘Iron Fist’

tribunal sentencing. They may be profoundly egotistical to the point of megalomaniacs, but they're not unaware that consequences of the most serious kind will be effected.

It was as powerful a set of communiqués as could be generated. With the consent of the Pentagon and Secretary of Defense, '60 Minutes' and its crack correspondent Scott Pelley conducted interviews on the front lines about the Afghanistan war. Scott interviews a corporeal and the geo-points are made that the U.S. military command is willing to sacrifice blood and treasure to secure Canada's democratic and Chinese-free future and Chinada malfeasant who put up a struggle can expect to face lethal military force.

The implications of how the coalition can destroy, manipulate and commandeer computers, data banks and telecommunications infrastructure are obvious and a large chapter could be authored to draw attention to everything that can be done to bring bellicose public and private sector parties perpetuating and protecting the Chinada *status quo* and complicit in the global hegemony initiative to their knees. There is only one that will be highlighted here: capital seizure.

Banking has primarily gone digital. Hundreds of billions and trillions of dollars aren't physically stored and transferred. These amounts are held and shipped around a region, country and internationally through computerized information systems. Over the last three and a half plus years all public sector members of the coalition have been tracing the capital and assets of the China-Canada military alliance with the objective of one day simultaneously confiscating them all. This couldn't be done without first passing regulations in each participating country – something that has now been achieved as Vice-President Biden pointed out during Chancellor Merkel's joint session speech on November 3, 2009.

One of the understandings that fueled the multitude of diplomatic representations by the coalition many partners about him taking possession of massive damages is the knowledge that this is how it will be achieved.

All of the foregoing is what led to the geo-politicization of the '60 Minutes' segment on November 8, 2009. Lexiconically red flagged was this description of what's in store for the pubescent psychopaths from an interviewed cyber security expert:

"In 2007 we probably had our electronic Pearl Harbor. [4:19: clip: Steve: Erin M.] It was an espionage Pearl Harbor," Lewis said. "Some unknown foreign power, and honestly, we don't know who it is, broke into the Department of Defense, to the Department of State, the Department of Commerce, probably the Department of Energy, probably NASA. They broke into all of the high tech agencies, all of the military agencies, and downloaded terabytes of information."

One example of what the coalition has done to prepare for covert regime change is explained on a general level in this passage:

Last November, someone was able to get past the firewalls and encryption devices of one of the most sensitive U.S. military computer systems and stay inside for several days.

"This was the CENTCOM network," Lewis explained. "The command that's fighting our two wars. And some foreign power was able to get into their networks. And sit there and see everything they did. That was a major problem. And that's really had a big effect on D.O.D."

Asked what he meant by "sit there," Lewis said, "They could see what the traffic was. They could read documents. They could interfere with things. It was like they were part of the American military command."

Lewis believes it was done by foreign spies who left corrupted thumbnail drives or memory sticks lying around in places where U.S. military personnel were likely to pick them up. As soon as someone inserted one into a CENTCOM computer, a malicious code opened a backdoor for the foreign power to get into the system.

Steve asks the expert what's America's competence in doing to others what's been done to United States public and private sector institutions and organizations:

"[7:04: Erin M.] How much of this are we doing? 'We' meaning the United States".

"We're in the top of the league, you know? We're as good as any," Lewis said.

"So, whatever foreign countries are doing to the United States, the United States is doing to them?" Kroft asked.

"We're in the top of the league. We are really good."

On destroying, disrupting and commandeering bank systems in Canada, this was said:

"I know that people in the audience watching this are going to say, 'Could somebody steal money out of my bank account or could somebody attack a bank that would wipe out my life savings?'" Kroft asked.

And the answer is yes, that's possible, but that is not the major problem. The more insidious issue is, what happens when the attacker is not attempting to steal money, but to destroy the process that

accounts for money? That's the real issue we have to worry about," McConnell said.

One top U.S. intelligence official is on record saying that the Chinese have already aggressively infiltrated the computer networks of some U.S. banks and are operating inside U.S. electrical grids, mapping out our networks and presumably leaving behind malicious software that could be used to sabotage the systems.

What the coalition found most valuable were cyber attacks launched against its Canadian representative's computer system. This non-stop barrage of reform and accountability sabotage opened a gargantuan back door which provided the Pentagon and its coalition colleagues around the world ability to examine the technologies, techniques and capabilities of the Chinada High Command. Given the attitude of feeling totally invincible, its principals and operatives continued their unlawful practices thinking they would never feel the ramifications of this exposure.

And how did the malfeasant respond to this '60 Minutes' segment being documented? They launched an attack on the author's Internet connection, slowing down the video stream so it looked like nothing more than a slide show of images.

- employing a time stamp of **5:53** and **6:10** to red flag the threat of executing the Chinada High Command;

- The American and foreign media have been intimately involved for a protracted period in achieving stated objectives;

Millions of Iranians claimed that the vote had been rigged. The world watched as they took to the streets, posing the most serious threat to the Islamic Republic since it came into being.

But the regime struck back and silenced anyone who dared speak out. You'll hear from a witness to it all, Iranian-Canadian filmmaker and Newsweek reporter Maziar Bahari, who was held by the Revolutionary Guard for 118 days.

When he was released, they warned him never to talk about his imprisonment or else. But last week he spoke to spoke to "60 Minutes" correspondent Bob Simon anyway, and gave us a rare insight into what's going on in Iran today.
