China's Vast Array of *De Facto* Governance Advancing & Protecting Interests and Networks Throughout Canada

After the discovery of *The Sidewinder Report* an investigation was commenced into determining exactly how large the Chinese population was in the country. According to StatsCan's in 2005 there were 1,277,451 registered Chinese immigrants in the country.

Between 1968 and 1976, about 90,000 immigrants from Hong Kong, mainland China and Taiwan came to Canada, and between 1977 and 1984, another 80,000 arrived from these sources (Li, 1998: 99). The next ten years, 1985-94, brought a drastic increase in Chinese immigration, with a total of 353,000 arriving. In all, over half a million immigrants came to Canada from Hong Kong, mainland China and Taiwan between 1968 and 1994; however, those from Hong Kong accounted for 68 per cent of the total volume, and those from mainland China, another 22 per cent (Li, 1998: 99). The increased volume of Chinese immigration to Canada in the 1980s and 1990s contributed substantially to the growth of the Chinese-Canadian population, which rose from 289,245 in 1981 to 633,933 in 1991 (Li, 1998: 67), and further to 1,094,700 in 2001 (Statistics Canada, 2003).

For the 7th consecutive year, China was the leading source country of total immigrants to Canada. In 2004, immigrants from China accounted for 15% of new immigrants to Canada and 34% of Canada's top Asian source countries. In 2004, China was the top source country of immigrants to Canada, accounting for 33% of the Asian total.

The size of the Chinese population as determined *supra* is inaccurate because of what news reports were saying about emigration that was not according to standard entry protocols. Repeated immigration scandals in Hong Kong and Beijing have led to the introduction of tens of thousands of Chinese nationals engaging in espionage posing as students, visitors and businessmen seeking and achieving close ties to government; the entrance of spies posing as business people is "an old rule used by China's intelligence service": *Asian Pacific Post*, Sept. 21, 2004.

Most Canadians don't have a clue what 'Approved Destination Status' means. If they did in the context of Chinese joint sovereignty and a full appreciation of the true and full nature of governance, they'd swiftly conclude a very large portion of the 1.3 million Chinese who live here aren't common folk of the totalitarian regime.

China in the early 1970s and today was and is a military-police-totalitarian state. Nobody disputes that. Then it shouldn't be difficult to comprehend and accept the argument that like the Soviet Union in its heyday, ordinary

Chinese citizens could never simply pick up stakes and move to another country. International mobility is not, nor ever has been, a right for everyone – that is, except high ranking members of the Chinese Communist Party. Since they've 'got the run of the place', they're entitled by virtue of enjoying privileges that totalitarianism delivers to move to another country if they want to. The rest of the population must follow the government's visa requirements; which is governed by what the Beijing leadership calls "Approved Destination Status". This is a list of countries that citizens can visit, go to school in or emigrate to.

It wasn't until late 2009 that Canada was put on the list. So the question naturally arises who precisely are these million or so Chinese who emigrated here over the last forty years? Are they regular citizens of the communist state – common folk who scraped together from meagre earnings enough to move to a foreign land? Or, more logical, did they get to leave the country because they have a special connection with the Beijing leadership – like friends and family of the ruling elite and those who are linked to the military and intelligence community?

China grants Canada Approved Destination Status

Canadian Tourism Commission (CTC) acknowledges the importance of Canada's agreement with China on Approved Destination Status (ADS) for Canada and our tourism industry.

"This agreement represents great potential for the visitor economy and future growth of the industry. The Canadian Tourism Commission will take full advantage of this agreement and begin marketing business and leisure travel opportunities to the Chinese people" said Michele McKenzie, CTC's President and Chief Executive Officer.

Up until this important development, CTC has not been able to market directly to consumers but has been preparing for ADS by establishing an entry-level team, leveraging tourism opportunities for Canada, and

creating key relationships on the ground that will be strategic going forward. With this CTC will propose and seek to implement a robust action plan to leverage the growing interest of Chinese travellers to Canada.

"ADS opens a very big door. We look forward to mobilizing quickly to take advantage of the 2010 Olympic and Paralympic Games and promoting Canada's image throughout this massive market," said Michele McKenzie.

In 2008 visits to Canada by Chinese citizens were up 5.3 per cent from the year before, for a total of 159,000. Chinese travellers had the highest average length of stay (28 nights) in Canada and spent more than visitors from any other country (\$1,648.51).

According to a Conference Board of Canada survey, ADS is expected to boost the yearly rate of travel to Canada from China by up to 50 per cent by 2015.

When that component of my research project pursuant to the CSIS-RCMP report was concluded, the discovery that there are a whopping *324 private sector associations* that cater to the Chinese immediately led to the conclusion they were used to advance Beijing's joint hegemony status and where Canadian's linked to it would go in part to advance that constitutionally violating and international law infringing circumstance.
